Christian College\University Applications: Application Fee: varies

Although there is no specific deadline or date by which the application must be sent, it is a good idea to apply early. Many Christian universities/colleges offer fee waivers for their application if the application is completed/mailed before the end of the calendar year. The earlier you apply, the better chance you have of being considered for scholarships, financial aid packages and obtaining the residence you desire. Applications can be obtained online and should be sent directly to the Christian College by the student applying. **Students must request his/her transcript to be sent to these institutions.** Although the sticker price for some of these institutions may be very high – financial aid packages often make these schools comparable in price to their public competition.

ACT Test (American College Test)

Using decades of empirical research, ACT provides data-driven solutions that encourage academic readiness and inspire career exploration while preparing students for college and career success. **The ACT is administered at Smithville Christian on Saturday December 8, 2012 - Students must register online at http://www.actstudent.org**

SAT (College Board)

While high school grades are a very useful indicator of how students will perform in college, **there is great variation in grading standards and course rigor within and across high schools**. More than **80 years ago** the College Board created the first **standardized college entrance test** to help colleges and universities identify students who could succeed at their institutions and to connect students with educational opportunities beyond high school. IELTS

The International English Language Testing System (IELTS) sets the standard for English language proficiency. It is the world's most popular language testing system with over 1.5 million candidates taking the test each year for education, career and immigration purposes. The IELTS test score is recognized by more than 6000 institutions in 135 countries as a trusted and valid indicator of the ability to communicate in English. Basic Application fee: \$130 Additional choices are \$44 each			
January 16, 2013	Deadline for Ontario secondary students to submit completed applications to the OUAC. However the earlier you apply, the better; applications can be modified after submission.		
February 5, 2013	Recommended last date for students to submit all information to the OUAC, including university and program changes. This is not a deadline date. Changes will be accepted and processed by the OUAC at any time.		
May 29, 2013	The latest date by which all secondary students can expect a response from an Ontario university.		
June 3, 2013	The earliest date by which universities may require a response to an offer of admission from an Ontario secondary school student.		
Early June-August	The Admission Information Service is available at the OUAC for applicants not admitted by June.
